Summary The Museum Prinsenhof Delft is organising the first ever

exhibition in the Netherlands devoted to the work of the famous Delft master Pieter de Hooch. Together with Johannes Vermeer, Pieter de Hooch (1629-in or after 1679) is considered one of the most important Delft masters of the Dutch Golden Age. De Hooch produced his finest paintings during his Delft years, 1652 to 1660, and the city plays a leading role in them. The Museum Prinsenhof Delft will bring these Delft masterpieces back to the city where they were created after an absence of almost four centuries, with works on loan from major collections all over the world. The exhibition will comprise approximately 35 paintings, 29 of which are by Pieter de

Hooch.

building dating back to the Middle Ages. It is of great historical importance, the site of some of the most dramatic and consequential events of Dutch national history. It was once the court of William the Silent, the

Father of the Dutch Nation.

Getting there The Museum Prinsenhof Delft is within approximately 10

minutes walking distance of the Delft railway station, via Westvest and Phoenixstraat. Bus 51 and tram 1 and 19 stop near the museum (stop: Prinsenhof). Rotterdam Airport is approximately 20 minutes from the Museum

Prinsenhof Delft; Amsterdam Schiphol Airport,

approximately 50 minutes. Parking is available at the

nearby Prinsenhof car park.
