Summary	<p>For the first time, the life of the world-famous Delft master Johannes Vermeer (1632-1675) will be the focus of an exhibition. Masterpieces by his Delft contemporaries will be presented next to Delft pottery, Delft tapestries, archival matter and biographical documents. With these, we will create a rich picture of the artistic, intellectual and social climate in Delft in the 17th century. The exhibition will run concurrently with the major Vermeer exhibition at the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam.</p>

Free open guided tours	<p>Every Sunday afternoon between 14.00 and 15.00, the museum offers free open guided tours (in Dutch). The theme of these tours will alternate each week between the highlights of the permanent collection and the exhibition <i>Vermeer's Delft</i>. Participation in the open tours is free upon presentation of an admission ticket.</p>
Family programme	<p>A 'family trail' (in Dutch) is available to families. It consists of a booklet with see and do assignments children (ages 4 to 12) can do with their (grand)parents to discover all sorts of things about Vermeer and his world.</p>
Podwalk	<p>In this narrated walk (in Dutch), we take the listener into Vermeer's city. You can listen to the podwalk anywhere: on the sofa at home, on the train and on a walk through the city of Delft, before or after visiting the exhibition.</p>
City programme	<p>Alongside the exhibition <i>Vermeer's Delft</i>, a city programme is being developed in cooperation with Delft entrepreneurs and cultural partners.</p>
About the museum	<p>The Museum Prinsenhof Delft is a monument of national importance, housed in a magnificent building dating back</p>

to the Middle Ages. Prinsenhof in Delft is the site of one of the most dramatic events in the history of the Netherlands: the murder of William the Silent, Prince of Orange, in 1584. Three iconic themes to which Delft owes its national importance and international distinction are central to the permanent collection: William the Silent, Prince of Orange, Delft Masters and Delftware.

Getting there

The Museum Prinsenhof Delft is within circa 10 minutes walking distance from the Delft railway station, via Westvest and Phoenixstraat. Bus 53 and trams 1 and 19 stop near the museum (stop: Prinsenhof). Parking is available at the nearby Prinsenhof car park or Phoenix garage (circa 3 minutes walking distance).

Rotterdam Airport is approximately 20 minutes from the Museum Prinsenhof Delft; Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, approximately 50 minutes.

Coaches

Coaches can park for up to 30 minutes at one of the three parking spaces for coaches in Phoenixstraat (near tram stop Prinsenhof).
